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FOREWORD

This budget scorekeeping report is prepared for the Senate by the Congressional Budget Office in cooperation with the Senate Committee on the Budget. It is generally prepared weekly except during non-legislative periods, if there has been action on bills with budgetary implications.

This report is designed specifically for the Senate. It provides a means whereby Senators and Senate staff can compare the present status of the budget to the congressional budget resolution currently in effect. The core of the report is a section containing a table for each Senate committee (and for each subcommittee in the case of the Appropriations Committee) showing the relationship of each committee's budget actions to the congressional budget resolution. This breakdown by committee, established under section 302 of the Congressional Budget Act, permits the scorekeeping system to keep track of budgetary actions in a manner consistent with the way the Senate does its work.

Much of the information in this report is in summary form. Back-up detail regarding any of the line items in the report or answers to questions regarding any aspect of the report may be obtained by calling the Budget Analysis Division of the Congressional Budget Office (225-5480).

We would welcome any comments and suggestions for improvements in the presentation of the basic data. Our objective is to make these reports as useful as possible for the Senate. 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INTRODUCTION

On May 24, 1979, the Congress adopted H. Con. Res. 107, the First Concurrent Resolution on the Budget for fiscal year 1980. The Resolution specifies (1) aggregate targets for budget authority, outlays, and revenues, as well as the level of the deficit and the level of the public debt for fiscal year 1980, and (2) budget authority and outlay ceilings for each of the 19 functional categories of the budget. The Resolution also contains revisions to the Second Concurrent Resolution on the Budget for fiscal year 1979. These figures form the basis for this scorekeeping report.

This report focuses on the relationship of the Budget Resolution totals to the budgetary actions of each Senate committee. This feature is made possible by the "crosswalk" provision of the Congressional Budget Act (section 302) whereby the Budget Resolution totals are allocated among the standing committees of the Senate, and those committees further subdivide the allocations among subcommittees or programs.

This report includes budgetary information relating to possible future congressional actions, in addition to information on actions completed and underway. Inclusion of information on possible future actions enhances the value of the report in presenting a full budgetary picture.

DOLLAR ESTIMATES

The Congressional Budget Office has determined all of the dollar amounts contained in this report. To the extent that items in this report are included in scorekeeping reports of the Congressional Budget Office, the dollar amounts are the same. It should be noted that many of the figures contained in this report are Congressional Budget Office estimates of the impact of congressional action and therefore are not firm. This is particularly true of all of the outlay numbers; the Congress makes decisions on specific figures for new budget authority in appropriation and other spending bills, but not on outlays which will result from these bills. In some other spending legislation, such as entitlement programs (e.g., social security, unemployment compensation), the budget authority figures also are estimates.

DEFINITIONS

Several terms that are used throughout this report are defined as follows:

—Current Estimate is where the budget now stands in the light of (1) congressional action on revenue or spending legislation that has been completed or is underway in the Senate, and (2) possible congressional action on legislation that is not yet reported in the Senate. "Action completed" includes

legislation enacted in prior years, enacted in this session of Congress, passed the Congress but not yet signed by the President (vetoed legislation is included until an override attempt is unsuccessful or until it is clear an override attempt will not be made), or on which conference agreement has been reached. "Action underway in the Senate" includes legislation that has passed the Senate or that has been reported in the Senate. In the case of "legislation not yet reported in the Senate," there is obviously an element of judgment in determining what legislation may eventually materialize. As noted in the various tables in the report, this judgment has been made by the staff of the Senate Budget Committee. As further noted, the dollar amounts in this category are tentative and subject to change. However, inclusion of this information is necessary to provide a complete picture of where the budget may come out.

- —Direct Spending Jurisdiction is a term that relates to the committees of the Senate that receive allocations under Section 302 of the Congressional Budget Act. It represents the portion of the budget over which a particular committee has direct control in the sense that legislation under its purview, when enacted, directly provides budget authority which forms part of the budget total. The total of all committees' direct spending jurisdiction, plus certain amounts not allocated to any committee, equals the total amounts in the Budget Resolution.
- -Entitlements Funded in Annual Appropriation Acts is a term that relates to the committees of the Senate that receive allocations under Section 302 of the Congressional Budget Act other than the Appropriations Committee. It represents the portion of the budget over which a particular committee has indirect control in the sense that legislation under its purview, while it does not directly provide budget authority because annual appropriation action is required, essentially "locks in" the appropriations process because the legislation involves entitlements of a mandatory nature. This legislation is tracked in the Budget Resolution crosswalk process and in the scorekeeping system so that the Senate in general and the Appropriations Committee in particular can be aware of the degree to which the budget is likely to be affected by legislation of this type.
- First Concurrent Resolution Allocation is a term used in connection with the committee tables in part II of the report. In the case of the authorizing committee tables and the Appropriations Committee summary table, it represents the allocation made to each committee pursuant to Section 302(a) of the Congressional Budget Act. In the case of the Appropriations subcommittee tables, it represents the amount allocated by the full Appropriations Committee to each subcommittee, pursuant to Section 302(b) of the Congressional Budget Act.

HOW TO USE THE REPORT

The report begins with a section highlighting major legislative actions of a budgetary nature that may occur this week in the Senate. The report then is divided into four main parts:

- -Part I presents summary tables for fiscal year 1980.
- -Part II presents tables detailing committee allocations within the budget totals for fiscal year 1980.
- -Part III presents the President's budget estimates for fiscal year 1980 and compares the President's appropriation requests to congressional action.
- -Part IV presents summary tables for fiscal year 1979.

Each of these parts is discussed below.

Part 1: FY 1980 Summary Tables. These tables are largely self-explanatory. Summary table I shows the budgetary aggregates in terms of the Budget Resolution and the current estimate. Summary table 2 provides further details regarding revenues. Summary table 3 provides further details regarding budget authority and outlays. Summary table 4 provides a listing of spending by function, comparing the current estimate to the Budget Resolution totals. Summary table 5 presents a listing of spending by Senate committee of direct spending jurisdiction, comparing the current estimate to the Budget Resolution "crosswalk" allocations to committees.

Part II: FY 1980 Committee Allocations. This is the most important part of the report. It includes a separate table for each Senate committee (and also a separate table for each Appropriations subcommittee) that details legislative actions under the committee's jurisdiction that are completed, underway, and in prospect, and compares the results to the committee's Budget Resolution allocation.

All of the committee (and Appropriations subcommittee) tables have the same general format. Section I lists the committee's allocation pursuant to Section 302(a) of the Congressional Budget Act (Section 302(b) in the case of the Appropriations subcommittees). Section II lists the current estimate of action completed, underway, and in prospect. Section III compares the current estimate to the Budget Resolution allocation. Section IV provides further details on the makeup of the current estimate.

All committee tables present information on direct spending jurisdiction (see Introduction for definition), but in addition, the tables for the authorizing committees present information on entitlements funded in annual appropriation acts that fall within the authorizing committees' area of responsibility. The dollar amounts for these programs fall within the direct spending jurisdiction of the Appropriations Committee, but since any action by the authorizing committee on such entitlements essentially "locks in" the Appropriations process, these amounts are crosswalked to both the Appropriations and the authorizing committees in the Budget Resolution. This information is also necessary for determining whether referrals of entitlement bills to the Appropriations Committee are necessary under Section 401(b) of the Congressional Budget Act.

Part III: FY 1980 President's Budget Estimates. This part of the report includes a table showing the President's latest budget estimate (this is not necessarily the President's budget request), as well as a table detailing congressional action on appropriation bills in relation to the President's appropriation request. The latter table is of particular use to the Appropriations Committee.

Part IV: FY 1979 Summary Tables. These tables summarize budgetary actions for fiscal year 1979, which are now largely complete. The tables are the same as those for fiscal year 1980 (see Part 1 above). Further details regarding fiscal year 1979 may be obtained from the Budget Analysis Division of the Congressional Budget Office (225-5480).

GENERAL NOTES

In the case of all tables in the report, details may not add to totals due to rounding.

All dollar estimates in this report are as of July 27, 1979. The latest report contains all of the information necessary for scorekeeping and supersedes all earlier reports.
